Speaker information

Anna Ohanyan is Associate Professor of Political Science at Stonehill College and a Fulbright Scholar in Armenia, 2012-2013. She is the author of “NGOs, IGOs, and the Network Mechanism of Post-Conflict Global Governance in Microfinance” (2008). She has published widely on international organizations, conflict resolution and peace building in such settings as Kosovo, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Afghanistan. She has served as a pre-doctoral and post-doctoral fellow at the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University (2002-2004). Her research has been supported by the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars (2007), German Marshall Fund (2010-2011), U.S. State Department/IREX (2011-2012), Stonehill College (2006 and 2008), Eurasia Foundation (2006) and Syracuse University (2001, 2002 and 2003). Concurrently with her research and teaching, Prof. Ohanyan was a consultant for numerous organizations such as the United Nations Foundation, the World Bank, the National Intelligence Council Project at the University of Maryland, the U.S. Department of State, the Carter Center and USAID. Her work has taken her across the globe, from Northern Ireland, to the Balkans and the South Caucasus.
